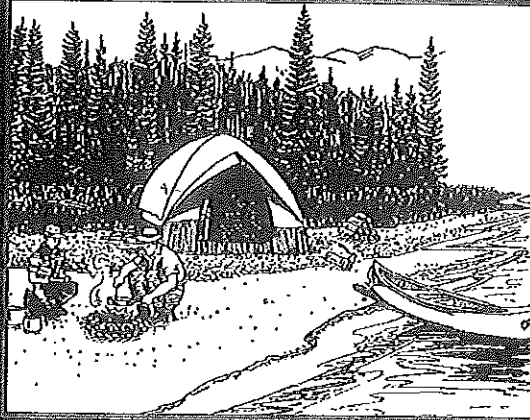

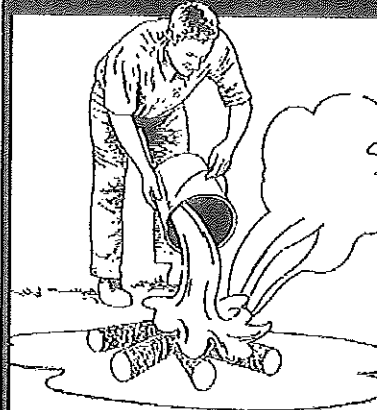

PROPERTY ASSESSMENT NOTICES FROM MPAC

Property owners are encouraged to visit aboutmyproperty.ca—MPAC's secure, online, easy-to-use self-serve website that allows property owners to learn more about how their property was assessed, see the information MPAC has on file, as well as compare it to others in their area.

AboutMyProperty has been redesigned this year and provides access to:

- * Market Trends—property owners can browse through the interactive maps to view information on residential sale price trends in their neighbourhoods and municipalities across Ontario.
- * A Property Profile Report—available through 'My Property', this section includes more information about the five key factors that account for 85% of a property's assessed value.
- * Property Snapshots—accessible through 'My Neighbourhood', owners can access up to 100 snapshots of data on other properties in their neighbourhood or area. This snapshot provides: property address, year built, square footage, lot size, number of storeys, Current Value Assessment, and sales information, if applicable.
- * Favourites Report—owners can compare their property with up to 24 saved Favourites. The report can be downloaded and includes address, Roll Number, Current Value Assessment, sale and site information, as well as residential structural details (e.g. square footage).

Property owners are also encouraged to look for their **Request for Reconsideration (RfR) deadline**, which is included on their Notice.

Owners will have 120 days from their Issue Date to file. More information on how to file an RfR is available on aboutmyproperty.ca.

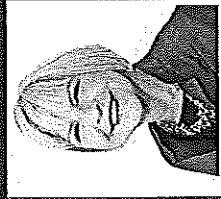

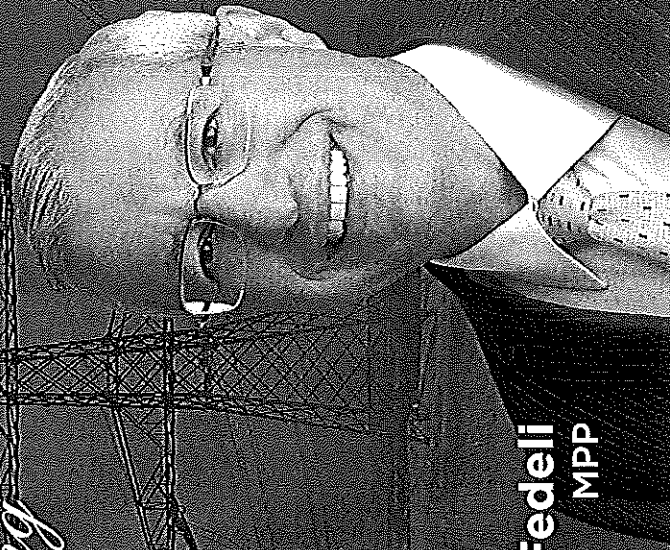

The THIRD meeting of the Ad Hoc Roads Committee was held this date at the Calvin Community Centre.

The meeting was called to order following the Regular Council meeting at 8:02 p.m. by the Chair, Councillor Adams.

2016-AH05 ADOPT MINUTES

Moved by Coun Edwards and seconded by Coun O'Connor that the minutes of the AD HOC Roads committee meeting held on Tuesday February 23, 2016 be hereby approved and will be included in the next regular meeting of Council for consideration of final approval.

The DRAFT "Road Definitions" By-law was reviewed in detail. There were some changes identified that need to be made to Section 5.0 a) Maintenance Standards for Seasonal Roads. Consideration will be made to amending the wording in order to reduce or eliminate any sense of vulnerability to those who may currently be living on, and maintaining a Seasonal Road, without having an Agreement with the Municipality in place. Concern was voiced by a person in the audience (Dean Grant) that the DRAFT wording meant that Council may be able to revoke an Agreement, leaving property owners vulnerable and no longer authorized to maintain a Seasonal Road currently used to access a year round residence. Amendments will be made and reviewed at the next AD HOC roads meeting.

Discussion then went to the Geometric Design Standards for Secondary Highways. It is the task of the AD HOC Roads Committee to DRAFT a policy for Council consideration, which addresses requests for "Assumption of Public Roads" for year round road maintenance service. It is intended that the policy will include these Standards in the wording in order to further define the requirements necessary for year round maintenance. The Acting Municipal Engineer has supplied the Clerk-Treasurer with the Geometric Design Standards for roads with a 0 - 400 Average Annual Daily Traffic (AADT) count up to >1000 AADT. All current Seasonal Roads within the Municipality are in the 0 - 400 AADT category. The Rural nature of most of the roads under the jurisdiction of the Municipality of Calvin could be Geometrically Designed to a lesser and more affordable standard if the speed limit was reduced to 50 or 60 km per hour from the current 80 km per hour. This speed reduction would also address safety concerns received about the high speed of motorists travelling on some roads (Peddlers Dr. and Mount Pleasant Rd. for example).

The Clerk-Treasurer is to prepare a DRAFT By-law for consideration at the April 12, 2016 Regular Meeting of Council which the AD HOC Roads Committee Chair will present. Such a By-law will authorize an overall posting throughout the Municipality of Calvin, to reduce the speed limit on all roads under Municipal jurisdiction, from the current 80 km per hour to 60 km per hour (would not of course apply to Provincial Hwy 630). This would allow all year round roads to be Class 5 and all Seasonal Roads to be Class 6, under the MMS. The decision of whether or not to reduce the overall speed limit, if acceptable to Council, could then be reflected in the Geometric Design Standards required for the Roads policy, yet to be DRAFTED, addressing the Assumption of Public Roads for year round road maintenance service.

2016-083 SUPPORT REQUEST TO RECONSIDER SUSPENSION OF THE RURAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM INTO THE JOBS AND PROSPERITY FUND
Moved by Coun Pennell and seconded by Coun Edwards
WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Calvin supports the following resolution by the Municipality of South Dundas passed at their regular meeting held on April 19, 2016 which states:

WHEREAS in the 2016 Ontario Budget, the government of Ontario has suspended current intake of applications to the Rural Economic Development Program and has indicated that it plans to integrate the Program into the Jobs and Prosperity Fund; and

WHEREAS the Jobs and Prosperity Fund is narrowly focused and is restricted to private sector organizations and industry partners, which prevents access to funding for rural municipalities and others who formerly benefitted from the Rural Economic Development Program. The emphasis on large projects that meet either of minimum \$5 million or \$10 million in

eligible project costs thresholds, will significantly restrict benefits from this fund; and

WHEREAS in contrast, the Rural Economic Development Program supported a number of capacity building projects including but not limited to 'Business Retention and Expansion' and 'Downtown Revitalization' projects and 'Economic Development Strategic Planning' projects for small rural municipalities who were looking to improve their local economy. Also of note is that because the Jobs and Prosperity Fund is not specifically designated for rural areas, that funds from this program will likely favour more urban areas of the province.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT resolved that the Municipality of South Dundas asks the government of Ontario to reconsider the suspension of and the integration of the Rural Economic Development Program into the Jobs and Prosperity Fund with the view to ensuring that the Rural Economic Development Program stays as an intricate funding program of the province that will support capacity building and foster economic growth in rural municipalities in Ontario.

BE IT FURTHER resolved that this resolution be circulated to all municipal and regional councils in Ontario requesting that they endorse and support this resolution and communicate their support to the Premier and the Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs.
