2016-111 RESOLUTION RE: SUPPORT FOR ENERGY EAST PROJECT

Moved by Coun Pennell and seconded by Coun O'Connor that WHEREAS TransCanada Pipelines Limited has put forward an application to develop the Energy East Pipeline which would convert an existing natural gas pipeline into oil and also the construction of new pipeline; and

WHEREAS the pipelines are already here in our area and transport natural gas close to our waterways, the company is looking to alter one of the lines to carry crude oil to the east coast for refinery; and WHEREAS the Ministry of Energy has mandated the Ontario Energy Board to examine and report on TransCanada Pipeline Limited's project through a consultation process; and

WHEREAS this pipeline would have significant impacts across Northern Ontario; and

WHEREAS research has demonstrated that fewer accidents occur while transporting oil by pipeline as opposed to alternate modes of transportation such as road or rail; and

WHEREAS TransCanada has demonstrated their commitment to pipeline safety for communities, residents and employees through safety and preventative maintenance programs; and

WHEREAS the Energy East project would generate significant economic benefits to northeastern Ontario by providing direct and indirect jobs during the six year development and construction phase and during the forty year operations phase; and

WHEREAS the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities (FONOM) supports the development of the Energy East Pipeline; THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council for the Municipality of Calvin hereby supports the development of the Energy East project, being mindful that proper safety precautions must be taken; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be forwarded to the Minister of Energy, Minister of Northern Development and Mines and the Leaders of the Opposition Parties.
