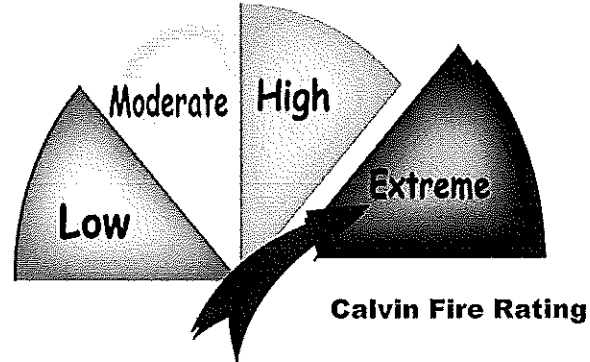

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Be aware that all persons setting an open fire within the municipality may be held:

- A) Responsible for the damage to property or injury to persons occasioned by the said fire, and**
- B) Liable for any cost incurred by the municipality, the Ministry of Natural Resources and including any necessary personnel, equipment and apparatus called to extinguish the fire.**

Every person who contravenes any provision of the Outdoor Burning By-law is guilty of an offence and shall, upon conviction, be subject to the fines set out under the Forest Fire Prevention Act and/or the Fire Prevention and Protection Act and is recoverable under the Provincial Offences Act.

It is your responsibility to be aware of the rules, regulations and by-laws pertaining to outdoor burning in this area. At any time the M.N.R or the Fire Department may ban or restrict outdoor burning in this area until further notice.

KEY INFORMATION TO MUNICIPAL ELECTORS IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF CALVIN REGARDING THE 2018 MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

Who Can Vote?

A person is entitled to vote in a municipal election if he or she on voting day,

- resides in the local municipality, or is the owner or tenant of land in the municipality, or the spouse of such owner or tenant; and
- is a Canadian citizen, and
- is at least 18 years old, and
- is not prohibited from voting under the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 or otherwise prohibited by law

Who Cannot Vote?

The following cannot vote:

- a person who is serving a sentence of imprisonment in penal or correctional institution;
- a corporation;
- a person acting as executor or trustee or in any other representative capacity, except as a voting proxy in a traditional election;
- a person who was convicted of the corrupt practice described in subsection 90 (3), if voting in the current election is less than five years after voting day in the election in respect of which her or she was convicted.

Are You on the Voters' List?

The List of eligible voters for the upcoming municipal election has been prepared by the Returning Officer/Clerk of your municipality.

As of September 3, 2018 all Voters should ensure that their names and relevant information are correct on the Voters' List. To be added, deleted or to make any other corrections to your information, contact or visit the municipal office where you are entitled to vote, with proper identification and proof of residence during normal office hours beginning September 3 up to and including the close of voting on October 22 at 8 p.m.

TRADITIONAL PAPER BALLOT

Electors in the Municipality of Calvin will be voting by traditional ballot. Electors will be notified of advanced voting date in mid-September 2018.

In order to vote, the elector must attend the voting station on October 22, 2018 and cast their ballot. To be added to the Voter's List the voter must have acceptable identification and proof of residence.



3. Familiarity with government forms and documents will be considered a definite asset.
4. Reliability, honesty and ability to maintain strict confidentiality are considered a MUST.
5. Must provide transportation to and from the polling station and training session and bring your own lunch/dinner for the duration of each required day.
6. Must be available to work at the Advance Polls on Tuesday October 2, 2018 (from approx. 11:30 am – 6:30 pm) and Saturday, October 13, 2018 (from approx. 11:30 am – 5:30 pm).
7. Must be available to work on Election Day Monday October 22, 2018 (approx. 9 a.m. – 11 p.m.).
