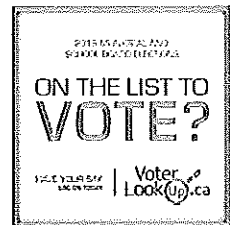

Bring Recyclables To Landfill Sorted In Three Groups

Recyclables Accepted At Calvin Landfill Site

NO FOOD – Containers MUST Be Rinsed

Group # 1 Plastic and Metal

Plastic Containers

Accepted:

We accept all plastic containers # 1 2 3 4 5 6 7. This includes plastic egg cartons, plastic muffin containers, tubs and lids, all small mouth plastic containers, liquid laundry and bleach containers. All lids must be removed. Containers must be less than 5L in size.

Metal Cans

Accepted:

Aluminum & steel (pop, soup, sauce, etc). Only clean items are accepted. Empty aerosol cans and empty dry paint cans are now recyclable. Paint can lids must be off.

Group #2 Paper

Newspaper and Mixed Paper

Accepted:

Newspaper: Including all inserts and flyers. Remove and discard plastic bags.

Group #3 Boxboard and Cardboard

Food and Beverage Containers

Accepted:

All Polycoat cartons (e.g. milk, juice) and Tetra Paks (e.g. drink boxes) are accepted. Remove and discard straws. Please rinse and remove lids.

Boxboard and Corrugated

Accepted:

Corrugated cardboard: Flatten and remove any plastics or Styrofoam (which is garbage). Use string or twine to tie bundles, not wire.

Boxboard: Cereal, pasta, laundry and shoe boxes, etc. Remove liners/windows and flatten boxes. Do not mix with newspaper and mixed paper. Bundle with corrugated

Do not include full cans or cans containing hazardous materials. These items should be taken to the **Hazardous Waste Depot at 112 Patton Street, North Bay. (Free of charge)**

Recycling with excessive contamination will not be accepted and must be sorted. You may be required to sort you're recycling into bin if you bring in large volumes of unsorted recyclables.

We thank you for your help with improving Calvin's recycling, if you have any questions please ask our staff.

Burning Regulations

Make sure you know the rules for outdoor fires and follow safe practices. Each year dozens of residents and cottagers across Ontario lose structures and property to fire caused by careless burning. Your Fire Department would like to remind you that **outdoor burning regulations are enforced between April 1 and October 31**. If you burn, follow these steps:

Choose a safe time

Any fire is most likely to get out of control on a hot, dry or windy day. Burn during the coolest dampest and calmest time of day. **Two hours before sunset, or later, and extinguish two hours after sunrise**. Don't even consider burning when it is windy. Be aware that in the spring after the snow melts and before the grass and buds have started to grow, it is extremely hazardous to burn.

Choose a safe site

If you are burning an area of grass or leaves, make sure the area is surrounded by a fireproof boundary. Roads, ditches or ploughed ground provide good barriers against fire spread. Your fire should be at least 18 meters (50 ft) away from any structure or forest debris that might catch fire.

Put that fire out

Remember, coals can smolder for hours and hot embers can be blown by the wind, easily setting fire to dry grass or twigs. Drown hot coals thoroughly, and then cover with sand or gravel.

Stay in control of your fire

Many injuries are caused by careless use of flammable materials and underestimating fire behaviour. Never use gasoline to start your fire as it is highly explosive. A responsible person must be available to tend the fire at all times, even if it is contained in an incinerator. You must have adequate tools (shovel, rake) and water on hand to control the fire if it begins to spread. Use caution around hydro poles and be aware of overhead and underground cables. Be sure your fire does not cause irritation or inconvenience to your neighbors.

Keep your fire small

Small fires can be controlled by one person using hand tools and water. When burning piles of wood, brush or wood by-products, make sure it's less than 2m (6.5 ft) high and 2m (6.5 ft) in diameter. Keep your fires limited to one pile burning per acre. Burning an open field is not a good idea, but if it is necessary, make sure you have the equipment and people available to do it safely.

DON'T BURN DURING THE DAY!

It is your responsibility to be aware of the Rules, Regulations and By-laws pertaining to outdoor burning in this area. Your municipality follows the provisions of the Forest Fire Prevention Act. The O.P.P. and M.N.R. have the authority to lay charges if you are found negligent.

At any time the M.N.R or Fire Department may ban or restrict outdoor burning in this area until further notice. Be aware that if a forest fire results because you have used fire improperly, you could be held responsible for the cost of putting out the fire and any property damage that may occur.



MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS ACT, 1996 (S.88.3-88.7) AS AMENDED


Under the Act, a Registered Third Party Advertiser is an individual, corporation or trade union that has registered with the Clerk. Corporations and Trade Unions are no longer permitted to make contributions to municipal elections campaigns; however, Corporations and Trade Unions may register as Third Party Advertisers during the campaign period in order to collect contributions and make expenditures in support of or in opposition to a candidate.

Filing Notice of Registration may only be made by completing and filing in the Office of the Clerk, on the prescribed Ontario Provincial Third Party Advertiser Form. Registration forms must be signed in person or by an Agent from the first business day in May 2018 (first day for filing nominations) to Friday, October 19, 2018 (the Friday before Voting Day) during regular office hours.

No faxes or other electronically transmitted registration notices shall be accepted. Original signatures are required.

2018-055 MINUTES OF COUNCIL MEETING
Moved by Coun O'Connor and seconded by Coun Pennell that the Minutes of the regular meeting of Council held on Tuesday April 10, 2018 be hereby adopted and signed as circulated.

2018-056 CALL ON PROVINCE TO GRANT AUTHORITY TO MUNICIPALITIES TO APPROVE LANDFILL PROJECTS
Moved by Coun Cross and Seconded by Coun Adams that WHEREAS municipal governments in Ontario do not have the right to approve landfill projects in their communities, but have the authority for making decisions for all other types of development;
AND WHEREAS this outdated policy allows private landfill operators to consult with local residents and municipal Councils, but essentially ignore them;
AND WHEREAS municipalities already have exclusive rights for approving casinos and nuclear waste facilities within their communities, AND FURTHER that the province has recognized the value of municipal approval for the siting of power generation facilities;
AND WHEREAS the recent report from Ontario's Environmental

Commissioner has found that Ontario has a garbage problem, particularly from Industrial, Commercial and Institutional (ICI) waste generated within the City of Toronto, where diversion rates are as low as 15%;
AND WHEREAS municipalities across Ontario are quietly being identified and targeted as potential landfill sites;
AND WHEREAS municipalities should be considered experts in waste management, as they are responsible for this within their own communities, and often have decades worth of in-house expertise in managing waste, recycling, and diversion programs;
AND WHEREAS municipalities should have the right to approve or reject these projects, and assess whether the potential economic benefits are of sufficient value to offset any negative impacts and environmental concerns;
THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Corporation of the Municipality of Calvin calls upon the Government of Ontario and all political parties, to formally grant municipalities the authority to approve landfill projects in or adjacent to their communities prior to June, 2018; and that in the case of a two-tier municipality, the approval be required at both the upper tier and affected lower tier municipalities;
AND FURTHER, that the Municipality of Calvin encourage all other municipalities across Ontario to consider this motion calling for immediate Provincial action.

2018-057 APPROVED USE OF MAIN STREET REVITALIZATION FUNDS
Moved by Coun Adams and seconded by Coun Cross that the Municipality of Calvin has been provided with funds in the amount of \$38,102 under the Main Street Revitalization Initiative Fund from the Province of Ontario, to be administered by the Association of Municipalities of Ontario; and Further that Council wishes to use the funding in two parts as follows, noting that Calvin is a very rural farming community that has a main road but not a "Main Street" where municipal buildings - Fire Hall, Public Works Garage and some home based businesses are located and it is considered most beneficial to our Main Road area to allocate these funds in the 2018 Budget as follows:
1) Under **Improvement of Community Energy Efficiency** - To add insulation and replace siding on the community Volunteer Fire Dept. building located at the Main Road/Street intersection, and;

2) Under **Streetscaping and Landscape Improvements - To Improve Connectivity** through the installation of a Wi-Fi tower at the Fire Hall site, which would allow high speed connectivity to all municipal buildings, improving emergency response to all residents and businesses, and also make high speed connectivity available to those home based businesses/residents in the reachable area of the new tower, who wish to connect to it.

2018-058 CALL FOR PROVINCE TO JOIN THE COURT APPLICATION OF THE HALTON MUNICIPALITIES

Moved by Coun Cross and seconded by Coun Adams that
WHEREAS under the *Municipal Act*, Ontario municipalities have the authority and responsibility to advance and protect the “economic, social and environmental well-being of the municipality” and the “health, safety and well-being of persons”;

WHEREAS the Provincial Government has designated Ontario municipalities to have responsibility to establish official plans that meet or exceed provincial standards for managing and directing physical change and effects on the social, economic, built and natural environment

WHEREAS CN Rail has declared that the Province of Ontario and the Halton Municipalities (the City of Burlington, the Town of Halton Hills, the Town of Milton and the Town of Oakville) and Conservation Halton have no regulatory role whatsoever with respect to a proposed truck/rail development that will have a direct impact on the economic, social and environmental well-being of the municipality and health, safety and well-being of residents;

WHEREAS the Halton Municipalities and Conservation Halton recognize that railways are a matter of federal jurisdiction, but assert that truck-rail developments have non-rail aspects that engage multiple areas of provincial and municipal government regulatory responsibility;

WHEREAS the Halton Municipalities and Conservation Halton have commenced a Court Application to confirm their legitimate regulatory role in respect of the CN development;

WHEREAS CN’s position that its proposed truck-rail development falls exclusively under federal jurisdiction, if upheld, would create a regulatory gap that would prevent the Province of Ontario, the Halton Municipalities and Conservation Halton from discharging their statutory responsibilities, and leave CN Rail, a for-profit company, to self-regulate on matters that engage provincial and municipal responsibilities; and
WHEREAS irrespective of the merits of CN’s proposed development, CN’s

interpretation of jurisdiction over this development, if upheld, would be detrimental to all provinces and municipalities that contain existing or proposed developments that engage matters of federal, provincial and municipal regulatory interest;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Municipality of Calvin endorse the principles that:

- a. there must be a cooperative approach to all developments that engage federal, provincial and municipal regulatory matters.
 - b. the existence of federal regulation over a development does not preclude and may require provincial and municipal regulation of the proposed development to avoid regulatory gaps.
1. THAT the Municipality of Calvin calls on the Government of Ontario to join the court Application of the Halton Municipalities.
